Dear Valued Customer:

Due to continued unrest in the Middle East and the corresponding jump in energy costs our resin suppliers have informed AEP that the recently delayed polyethylene increase has, in fact, implemented effective February 1st. Several grades of polyethylene resin remain under tight supply conditions and the manufacturers have announced subsequent increases for March which we will monitor closely. Even though the increase is not reflected on all tracking services AEP Stretch Film will implement our increase (originally scheduled for February 7th) as follows:

Based on the February 1st PE increase AEP Stretch Film will implement a 5% increase for standard grade and premium products effective with all orders placed on or after March 9th, 2011. All orders must call for immediate delivery.

Due to tight resin availability and extended lead times AEP will strictly limit our customer's orders to a quantity equal to one month of their average historical six months purchases. In addition, we reserve the right to accept or decline orders for any reason.

AEP Stretch Film values the relationship with each of our customers. We are working diligently to limit the exposure of a volatile resin market and its impact on our mutual business. We will continue to communicate changes within the market as they evolve.

Several polymer producers have advised Berry Plastics that previously announced raw material increases will indeed occur in February, and at least one additional increase has already been announced. The reasons cited for these price surges in 2011 are:


- Oil price increases in the US and abroad impacting the relative cost of feed-stocks
- Uncertainty over the situation in several oil producing nations in the Middle East
- Increasing demand for resin as markets recover from the global recession
- Rapidly growing demand for resin in the emerging markets.

Because of this most recent February resin increase, Berry Plastics will implement our previously announced February 5, 2011 increase of **6-8%** increase (actual increase amount will be product specific) on all Berry **Stretch Film** products with orders placed on or after **March 14, 2011** and shipping on or after March 28, 2011. Berry reserves the right to limit the size of those orders to historical quantities to better serve the anticipated demands of our customers.

Our raw material producers have implemented their previously announced price increases. The unrest in the Middle East and the consequential jump in energy costs as well as short supply of feedstock resulted from unscheduled shutdowns have been stated as major reasons for the implementation of these increases. Because of this escalation of resin price, we regrettably must increase our film price.

Effective with all orders received on and after March 14, 2011, there will be a 6-8% per pound price increase for all AmTopp Stretch Film products.

We will continue to provide you with additional pricing updates if market conditions change.

It is very important to take note that orders will be limited. We will strictly limit orders to your average monthly shipments during the last six months. We must reserve the right to limit orders during this period and reserve the right to accept and decline any order. Please contact your sales representative if you need any additional information.

Paragon Films previously announced a price increase scheduled to be implemented February 5, 2011. The resin suppliers then delayed both January and February resin increases, 30 days respectively.

Based on continuing civil unrest in the Middle East, driving oil prices to levels not seen in over two years, those increases are now being implemented. Rising feedstock prices and export demand remain factors initiating the increases.

As a result of these developments, Paragon will implement a 6-8% increase effective with orders placed on or after March 14. Orders not shipping prior to April 4 are subject to the increased pricing levels.

Orders will be limited to your average one month purchasing levels. Paragon reserves the right to accept or reject orders for any reason.

The second increase from the resin companies is still pending. Paragon will continue to inform you of future developments in the resin markets as they occur. Please contact your Paragon sales representative with any questions.

Back in January, Sigma Stretch Film announced an increase that was to take effect February 14th. As you know, the resin increase associated with our film increase was delayed by 30 days but has now come to fruition in February. This is despite not being currently estimated by all of the chemical reporting agencies. Middle East unrest, increased feedstock costs, and operating issues are all contributing to the strength of these current resin hikes. As a result of this February resin increase, Sigma Stretch Film must announce the following:

All orders placed on or after March 9th will be priced at a 5% increase. All orders must call for immediate delivery. Based on current product lead times and shortness of resin supply, Sigma can only accept a limited number of new orders. Check with your local plant location for the most current lead times. Pricing for orders accepted is based upon local lead times and available resin. Sigma Stretch Film reserves the right to accept or decline all orders for any reason.

Please rest assured that we will continue to support our loyal customers and we will do everything possible to minimize the effect these increases place upon your business. Please be aware that there is a \$.08 resin increase that is pending for March 1st. Sigma Stretch Film will be forced to announce further film increases if this March 1st \$.08 takes hold. We will monitor this latest increase situation very carefully and will advise our customers if there are any changes to its status. Your Sigma Stretch Film sales representative will be in contact with you to answer any of your questions and advise you of any changing market conditions.
